The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors called the meeting to order at 6:40 P.M.

Mr. Ray Varney, VDOT Resident Engineer, presented information on the draft of the Secondary Six-Year Plan. He stressed the importance of having projects that are eligible for federal dollars. There was discussion regarding the roads on the Plan.

He said that the only difference between the current draft plan and the previous year adopted plan is that Coleman Lake Road is not on the current one, and Ferndale is.

There was discussion regarding Spain Road and the possibility of paving a portion of it.

Mr. Varney asked for an agreement as to which projects need to be in the Secondary Six-Year Plan. He stated that congestion is a big issue and he would suggest, in his opinion, the three main priorities should be Ferndale, River Road and Baltimore Road.

Ms. Moody asked about paving Booth Road.

Mr. Varney said that he would have to assess traffic count to see if it was sufficient for paving Booth Road.

Mr. Varney suggested that a Transportation Committee was needed. That committee could look at the roads in the county that need work. The committee could then come back to the Board with their findings.

Ms. Moody said that she had suggested a Transportation Committee as well.

County Administrator Horwedel said that this has been discussed and there is agreement that it is needed.

Mr. Stone questioned the traffic count on Spain Road.

Mr. Varney said that it does have an appropriate traffic count to qualify.

Mr. Horwedel suggested to the Board that they get lists to Staff or to Mr. Varney as to any roads that they were interested in getting more information on.

Mr. Horwedel also asked that Mr. Varney draft what he understands to be the Board's wishes for the Secondary Six-Year Plan, and that will be put on the consent agenda for the next meeting.

Upon motion of Mr. Stone, seconded by Mr. Haraway the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 P.M.
