KEVIN MASSENGILL AS NEW COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR ~**

**DINWIDDIE** – Chairman Doretha E. Moody announced today the selection of W. Kevin Massengill as the new County Administrator.

Massengill was hired by Dinwiddie County in 2002 as the Assistant County Administrator and Division Chief of Planning and Community Development. During his tenure he has been named County Administrator on two separate occasions. Once upon the retirement of Wendy Weber Ralph in January 2005 and most recently when the County Administrator position was vacated by Gregory S. Horwedel who resigned from the position for family reasons in November of 2005.

Before coming to work for Dinwiddie County, Massengill held the position of Deputy Director in Governor James S. Gilmore, III and Governor Mark R. Warner Offices. In this capacity, he was responsible for the daily operations of the largest division of the Governor's staff and worked closely in public relations and tracking legislation in the General Assembly.

Massengill has resided in Dinwiddie County for most of his life. He is married to Courtney Warf Massengill of Carson, Virginia and they have one son Colby Massengill who is 2 years old. In addition, Massengill is a member of Ocran United Methodist Church and the Sutherland Ruritan Club.
