Subject: Surplus of Ambulance 81 (Vehicle #9696)

### **BACKGROUND**

The Dinwiddie Volunteer Rescue Squad ceased EMS operations in December of 2008. Since that time the squad leadership has been working through the process of dissolving the squad's assets. The first step in this process is for the squad to distribute its five vehicle fleet and equipment. Recently, the squad has given one ambulance to Rowanty Technical Center to be used for training purposes in its EMT program. Two ambulances have been given to the Ford Fire & EMS Dept. and the McKenney Fire & EMS Dept respectively. Both of those units are being licensed and placed in service within the County EMS system. In addition, a light duty rescue vehicle is being given to the Old Hickory Volunteer Fire Dept. and will be utilized to replace an outdated rescue vehicle there. The remaining vehicle is a 1992 Type 1 ambulance that was replaced by the County and removed from service in 2006. Since that time, the ambulance was given to the Dinwiddie Sheriffs Office who intended to reuse the vehicle. However, due to several issues with the vehicle it was subsequently returned to the squad. At the current time, no other County department has expressed interest in the vehicle.

Based upon these facts, the squad would like to attempt to dispose of the unit by selling it. The vehicle was purchased by the squad in early 1992 and subsequently titled to the County for insurance purposes. Therefore, in order for the squad to dispose of the unit in this manner, the County technically has to surplus the vehicle back to the squad. Any funds generated from the sale will be dispersed when the squad completes its dissolution process. Legally all of these funds must be dispersed to or remain with non profit agencies.
